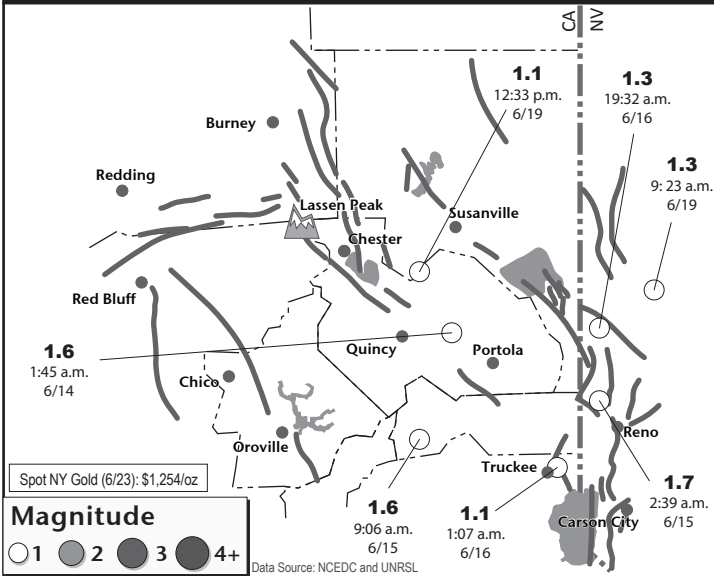


# Earthquake Report

June 14-20, 2017

- It was another quiet seismic week in Northeastern California as the number of earthquakes declined from the previous week, falling by three and back to the single-digit levels. It was the 8th time this year and the 10th time in the past seven months that activity was this quiet.

- The intensity of seismicity remained relaxed as well as no activity registered M 2.0 or stronger. It was the second time in two weeks and the 5th time 13 weeks that no M +2.0 activity had been recorded.

- The largest quake measured M 1.7 and occurred at 2:39 a.m. on June 15 a few miles northwest of Reno in the Mogal-Verdi area. It occurred in the same location as an intense earthquake swarm in 2008 that included hundreds of quakes, three of which measured in the M 4 range and the largest registered M 4.7. Activity in this area has been relatively quiet since, with only minor events like this on occasion.
- A quake measuring M 1.1 was recorded on the back side of Keddie Ridge near the Plumas-Lassen County line, in the upper Cooks Creek drainage. Activity here is somewhat rare.
- A M 1.6 jiggle was detected on June 15 above Spring Garden under Grizzly Ridge.
