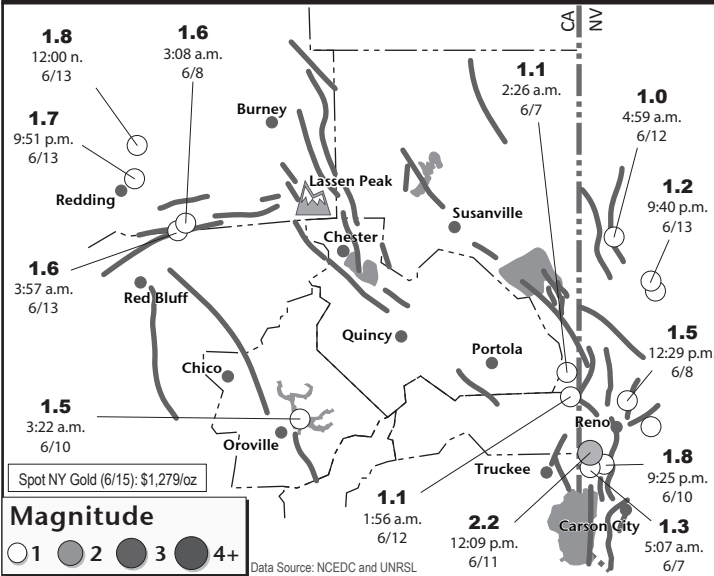


Earthquake Report

June 7 - 13, 2018

- The number of earthquakes registering M 1.0 or stronger increased slightly from the previous week, rising by six and back to the mid teens.
- The intensity of seismicity remained relaxed as only one quake registered M 2.0 or stronger.
- Minor activity continued southwest of Reno in the Carson Range where three more quakes were recorded. The largest measured M 2.2 and occurred during the noon hour on June 11. Two quakes

- registering in the M 3 range occurred here two weeks ago.
- Small earthquakes continued on the California border northwest of Reno near Border Town and Hallelujah Junction, and a couple small quakes triggered in the hills northeast of Reno.
- Strangely, all of Plumas County and Lassen Peak was quiet this week. That hasn't happened in a long time.
- Light activity returned to the northern Sacramento Valley region. A pair of M 1.6s were detected on the Battle Creek Fault Zone east of Cottonwood, a M 1.7 triggered just northeast of Redding, and a M 1.8 happened at noon on June 13 at Lake Shasta.
