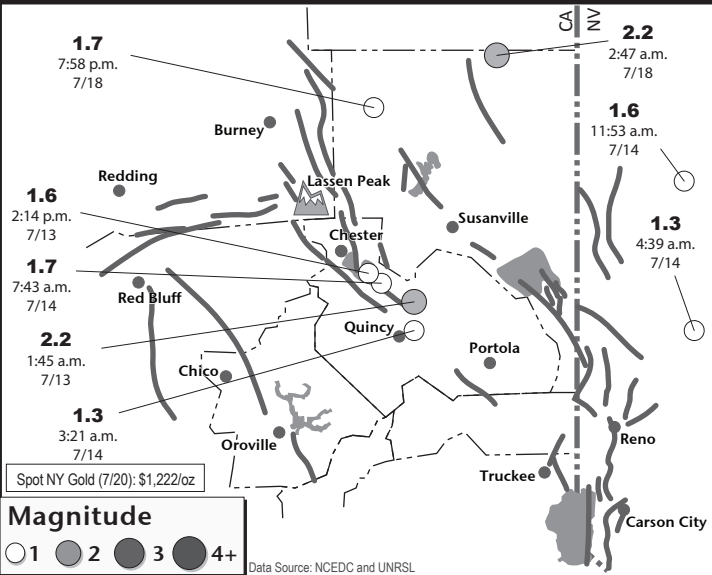


Earthquake Report

July 12 - 18, 2018

- It was another quiet seismic week as the number of earthquakes declined again, this time falling to the single-digit levels. It was the second time in six weeks and the third time this year that activity has failed to reach the 10 quake-per-week mark. Last year was much quieter than this year, producing eleven single-digit weeks.
- Two quakes registered in the M 2 range and both measured M 2.2. The first happened at 1:45 a.m. Friday, July 13 southeast of Crescent Mills close to Indian

Falls. It passed without being felt. It was one of four quakes that occurred between Quincy and Lake Almanor, two near Canyon Dam and one about a half mile northeast of Quincy where Chandler Creek comes into Greenhorn Creek.

- The other M 2.2 quake triggered at 2:47 a.m. Wednesday morning in northern Lassen County near Moon Lake. This is a remote area and it is unlikely to have been felt. Another quake in northern Lassen County measured M 1.7 and happened at 7:58 p.m. Wednesday about 17 miles southeast of McArthur at Bald Mountain. This area is also very remote and the quake was not felt.
- A couple of M1s occurred north of Reno.
